**Where:** Mt Aspiring Hut, Matukituki Valley

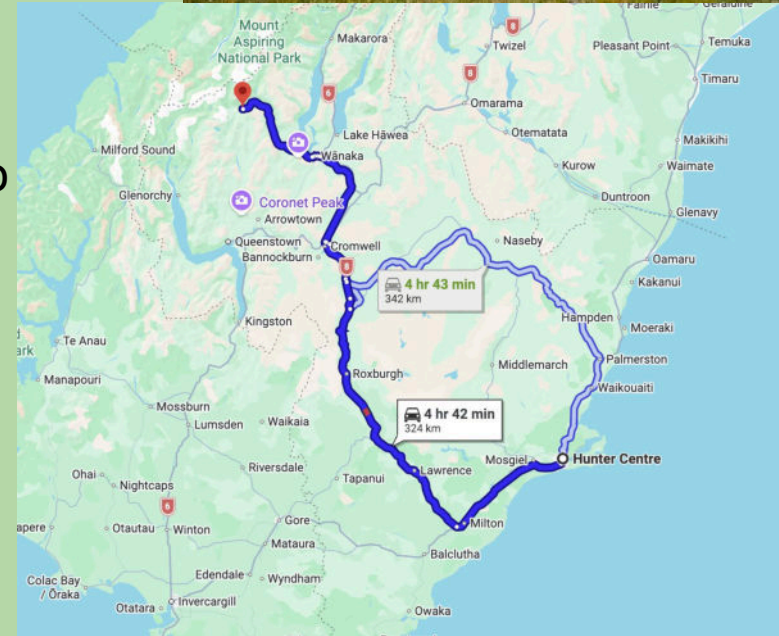


# Saturday Morning.

# Walk into Mt Aspiring Hut

**Walk Time:** 2-2.5 hours

**Distance:** 9km

**Elevation:** Not Much (Maybe 100m)

# Meals

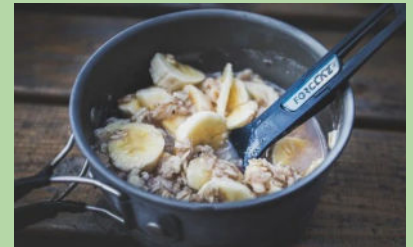
We will likely do dinner in small groups - car groups will probably be easiest or you can do individual.

Tenting (spots TBC) - you will need to bring a tent, sleeping mat and sleeping bag.

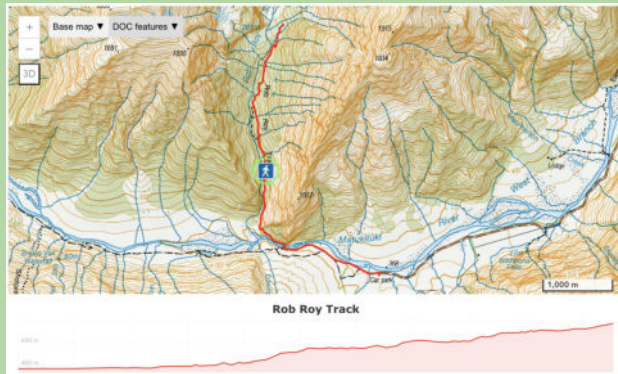


Walk out and Drive Home On Sunday

# Potential Side Trips - would be run in smaller groups

## *Rob Roy Glacier*

10km return, 3-4 hour, 400m elevation gain, relatively well maintained track, some steep drop offs



## **Cascade Saddle - Expert**

(would have to assess capabilities) - would be a big long day but epic views, probably a smaller group would do this



**Or people can chill at hut and swim in river :)**



# Cost

What this includes - Fuel/Transport, hut booking fee (private hut)



# Weather
